IMPORTANT INFORMATION

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

Flu vaccinations are mandatory for all registered horses and ponies, and they must be in possession of a valid flu vaccination certificate. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the horse's vaccinations are up to date and correctly recorded on the diagrammatic vaccination record. Spot checks will be regularly carried out at the show. The horse/pony must have received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Only these two injections need to have been given before a horse/pony can compete in competitions. In addition, a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year apart. Horses/Ponies must have received the full course of vaccinations or the booster at least 7 days prior to the competition date, and not more than 1 year after the previous booster.

The following closing dates for entries will be strictly adhered to and entries received after the appropriate closing date may **NOT** be accepted.

All entry forms must be fully completed with correct entry fees and stabling charges which MUST be included and must be signed, or entries will be returned unprocessed. Cheques to be made payable to **Grandstand Media Ltd.**

CUPS AND TROPHIES

All winners of first and second prizes must compete for such Championships, Challenge Cups or Trophies for which they are eligible as it may be required by the Special Conditions applicable to the competitions in which they have competed: in default of so doing, competition prizes will be forfeited, at the Organiser's discretion.

Competitors who become winners of Challenge Cups or Trophies at the Show must give security to British Showjumping and Grandstand Media Ltd that the Cups will be forthcoming and delivered to the British Showjumping office in good and proper condition, whole, undamaged and un-defaced on or before 30th June 2024 and if required to do so, will execute or procure the execution of a bond to this effect to the satisfaction of the Organisers.

Competitors who become winners of Challenge Cups or Trophies at the British Showjumping National Championships report to the Equestrian Office where a Prize Card must be completed before cups can be collected. Trophies that are not collected during the show may be collected afterwards from the offices at Grandstand Media Ltd., provided prior arrangements have been made. The Organisers will not undertake to forward trophies by post or carriers after the Show to prize winners. Overseas competitors will not be allowed to remove any Cup(s) from Great Britain.

Please note that due to their value, some trophies will not be able to be taken away from the showground and will only be available for the presentation.

RUGS AND SASHES

Winners of all British Showjumping Championship Finals will receive a Champions Rug and Champions Sash.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be paid out after the show by BACS – Please ensure that you have filled out the Prize Money form

SHOW ADMISSION

Admission to the British Showjumping National Championships is free of charge. Public car parking will be available on site at Stoneleigh Park, entrance via the Main gate, please follow signage to designated parking area.

PARKING

No caravans or mobile homes will be admitted to the showground or tents sited on the showground without a valid camping pass. Cars towing caravans must be parked in the caravan area.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every competitor, owner, rider, handler, (hereinafter known as "Competitor") at the British Showjumping National Championships must make themselves conversant with these General Rules and Regulations, in addition to the Special Conditions applicable to the various Classes and Competitions. Competitors may only compete on the understanding that they comply with and are bound by these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions relating to each Class or Competition.

1. ONSITE STABLING

ALL STABLING IS SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY

STABLES ARE BOOKED FROM 17.00 ON THE DAY OF ARRIVAL (15:00 on MONDAY 31st JULY) UNTIL 16:00 ON THE DAY OF DEPARTURE

A deposit of £20 per stable is required, payable by cash or card to the Stable Managers on arrival. This will be refunded on departure following inspection by the Stable Managers to ensure the stable has been left mucked out, clean, tidy, with beds banked up and in good repair. If paid by card refunds can only be issued back to the payment card.

Horses and ponies must be removed from their stables by this time, which must be strictly adhered to. Grandstand Media Ltd. reserves the right to charge the daily rate for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by Grandstand Media Ltd. to any person failing to remove their horse/pony from any stable by the designated time, it further reserves the right to deduct such charge from any prize money due and entries may be refused for future shows.

Vacated stables must be left in the state they are found. Any stables left in an unsatisfactory condition will incur a charge. No permanent stables are available.

PLEASE NOTE. ALL STABLES MUST BE VACATED BY: 16:00 SUNDAY 6TH AUGUST.

Stabling is available subject to capacity. Applications must be made online or using the appropriate paper form and fees paid in full. **The final date for application is 24th July 2023** Stables are sold on a first come, first served basis.

If stallion stables are required, please indicate in the Stallion Box section on your application.

Emergency Contact Stable Card (ECSC)

ECSCs must be obtained from the Stable Manager's Office upon arrival at the Show. It is the responsibility of the owner/competitor to complete the card in full and affix to their horse's stable door for the duration of their stay at the show.

While every reasonable effort will be made to contact the owner/competitor of the animal, if unsuccessful, the Veterinary Surgeon will treat the animal as they find necessary.

1.2 Reception or Removal

Horses or ponies for which stable accommodation has been reserved will be received at the Show on or after (and not before) 15:00 on Monday 31st July 2023.

Horses and ponies will not be admitted prior to this time. All horses and ponies, upon arrival at the Show, will be subject to the rules and regulations of the Show. All animals must be removed from the showground by 21:00 on Sunday 6th August 2023.

1.3 Bedding and Forage

Bedding will not be provided. A limited amount of the following may be purchased at the time of entry and from the Stable Managers Office. Available on a first come first served basis.

1.4 Cancellation/Changes of Stabling

There will be NO REFUNDS for stabling and no changes/transfers of any booked stables.

2. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES

Bookings are subject to availability ONLY. Passes for lived in horseboxes will be posted to competitors before the show. If you require an additional horsebox pass, please email entries@grandstand.co.uk. Additional passes are not guaranteed and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis dependent on availability. Under no circumstances will a lived-in horsebox space be reserved for a competitor unless the official entry form or online entry has been completed correctly by **24**th **July 2023**.

3. ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

On arrival at the show, if applicable competitors should report to the Stable Manager's Office where their stable booking will be confirmed.

Please note that competitors with horses and/or ponies arriving at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will not be admitted between the hours of 20:00 and 06:00 (Gates will be open until 21:00 on Monday 31st July)

Due to FIRE REGULATIONS and the licence issued by Warwick District Council, the following will be strictly enforced:

- a. All lived-in horseboxes will be sited by Grandstand Media Ltd. personnel at the required distance and should not be moved before leaving the showground.
- b. All competitors/grooms living in horseboxes must ensure that they know the location of the nearest fire point and fire-fighting equipment.
- c. All vehicles must be equipped with a fire extinguisher.
- d. Cars which are not towing a horse trailer, caravans and motor homes are not permitted in the Horsebox Park.
- e. All caravans and motor homes must be parked in the official campsite area, which must be prebooked before arrival.

4. CAMP SITE

Camping facilities are available on site. These can be booked at the time of making your entry. Pitches are available from 15:00 on Monday 31st July. All pitches must be vacated by 21:00 on Sunday 6th August.

5. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES WITH PORTALOOS

Occupants of lived-in horseboxes with their own toilet facilities may not empty them on the showground. Anyone found to be emptying Portaloos or similar at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will be removed from site and liable to any charges imposed by the organisers. There are a number of permanent toilet blocks around the site.

6. STABLE AREAS AND HORSEBOX PARK

6.1 Personal Belongings

Please note, any items left within the stabling area and horsebox park are left at the owner's own risk. Grandstand Media Ltd. will not be held responsible for any items left unattended.

6.2 Unauthorised use of stables

Any competitor or his/her representative who enters or makes use of any stable that has not been officially reserved for his/her use will be liable for the daily charge for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by Grandstand Media Ltd. We reserve the right to deduct any charges from any prize money due and entries may be refused for future shows.

6.3 Smoking and Fire Risks

- No smoking will be permitted in or near the stable area
- No hay may be stored under or near to any vehicle in the Horsebox Park at any time but may be stored inside the horsebox.
- Additional containers containing flammable liquids/gases are not permitted to be stored outside of lorries or caravans.
- The use or possession of barbeques of any type will not be permitted at any time in the Horsebox Park or elsewhere on the showground.

IF FOUND, ANY OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED ARTICLES WILL BE CONFISCATED AND REMOVED BY THE STABLE TEAM.

6.4 Electrical Hook-Up

Optional electrical hook-up is available to be purchased at the time of making an entry. No vehicle will be connected to the power supply that does not display a valid pass. There is no charge to park any horseboxes that are not connected to the electrical hook-up.

6.5 Motorised Vehicles

The use of electrical buggies, motorcycles, motorised scooters and other internal combustion machines is **FORBIDDEN** on the showground. Authorised vehicles ONLY.

Please note: Disability scooters are permitted for those who require them.

6.6 Bicycles & Scooters

The use of bicycles, scooters and similar items are not permitted in the tradestand or competition area. Bicycles and scooters ridden anywhere else on the showground are permitted but must be ridden sensibly. Failure to adhere to this may result in removal of the item by the organisers.

6.7 Dogs

All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. No dogs are permitted in the competition and exercise areas of the showground, with the exception of assistance dogs. Please ensure you clean up after your dog. The organisers reserve the right to impose a £100 fine to anyone who is seen to not clean up after their dog.

ENTRIES

Competitors must be bona fide owners (or such persons nominated by the owner to be their authorised agent to make the entry on the owner's behalf) at the closing date of entry of the horses/ponies which they are entering.

The person who made the original entry will be considered the owner (or their authorised representative) and he/she alone will be recognised as being entitled to any cups or prize money which may be won by the entries made by him/her. Entries must be made on via the official Online Entry System at <u>www.bsnationalchampionships.co.uk</u> and must be duly completed and authorised by the Competitor or their authorised agent.

Entries are accepted subject to any unforeseen circumstances, including but not limited to, military exigencies, strikes, or other civil disturbances, fire or other contingencies of any description preventing or rendering it undesirable in the opinion of the organisers for the Show to take place. All entries shall stand for any postponed Show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Show Secretary within one week of notification or public announcement in the press of such postponement. The postponement or abandonment of the Show, either before the opening or at any time during the Show, shall not give rise to any claim whatsoever against the Show or the Organisers by the competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entries in respect of classes or competitions not held. In the case of postponement, a refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.

8. AUTHORISED AGENTS

Any Entry Form (manual or online), objection or other document required by these Rules to be signed by a competitor may be accepted if signed on behalf of the Competitor by an agent whom the Organisers are satisfied is duly authorised to do so.

9. ENTRY FEES

No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fees. In the event of non-payment the entry will be refused until such time that full settlement is made, which must be before close of entries.

10. SUBSTITUTIONS

No alterations or substitutions of any entry will be allowed after the closing date of entries without permission of the Show Secretary. Entries must therefore be made in the appropriate competition(s) or class(es) for which animals are eligible.

11. AGE AND HEIGHT

In any height restricted classes competitors must ensure they fulfil any requirements for a valid Joint Measurement Board Annual or Full Height Certificate as per individual class guidelines.

The age and height of each horse/pony entered, and any other specific particulars must be accurately stated on the entry form if required by the conditions of the competition. A false declaration or mis-statement of any kind, including change of name of a horse/pony, incorrect description or false declaration of prizes won at horse shows, may at the discretion of the Organisers; disqualify a competitor from the Show and the horse/pony entered from any prize and from entering or being entered again at the Show.

In particular, a mis-statement as to the height will automatically render the animal ineligible for any judging or prizes. Competitors must be prepared to verify any statement made in a manner required by the

Organisers. All entries must be made in the name of the horse/pony under which it is registered with the relevant association/society and must correspond with the name shown on the Annual or Full JMB Certificate and National Passport at all times.

12. DECLINING ENTRIES

The Organisers may at their absolute discretion, decline any entry, exclude or remove any person or animal from the Show or future Shows or return any entry fee without being required to assign any reason or being liable for any compensation.

13. FORFEITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and charges for stabling, passes and horsebox parking if appropriate. No refund will be made in any circumstances.

14. CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Any competition for which there are not at least four entries under the ownership of different competitors may be cancelled. Competitors in the cancelled competition will be notified and may, at their option up to the 24th July 2023, transfer the entries originally made to other competitions for which the animals originally entered may be eligible.

15. PROGRAMME AND CONDITIONS

The Organisers reserve to themselves the right to alter the timings, cancel, add to or amend any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require, increasing or reducing the number of Sections, and amend the Prize Money in such cases.

16. JUDGING

In all competitions, the Judges will select such animals in each class as they consider eligible for prizes of commendation. When they deem a veterinary examination necessary, such examination will be made before the prizes are awarded. This veterinary examination will be conducted by the show Veterinary Surgeons whose decisions shall be final and the result of such examination will be considered as confidential. No second opinion may be given. The Veterinary Surgeons may approach a Judge to enable consultation over an animal's soundness.

Further, the Judges shall have power at their discretion to withhold any prize for want of merit or any cause.

17. NO ADMISSION TO THE SHOW ARENA(S)

No person shall enter the Show Arena(s), which includes any space enclosed or set apart for judging or hold any communication with any Judge or examining Veterinary Surgeon without the signed permission of the Organisers or one of the Show Officials.

18. EXERCISE

No horse or pony will be allowed into the Competition Arenas or collecting rings for exercise at any time. No horse or pony will be allowed into the external Exercise Areas, except at such times as are announced or posted, or as stated in the timetable.

If the exercise arena is closed, then under no circumstances is anyone on the showground permitted to use any arena for exercise. Grandstand Media Ltd. will accept no liability for any accident or injury for any party failing to adhere to the rules as set out in this schedule. The external Exercise Areas will only be open during the following times:

Monday 31 st July 2023	15:00 - 20:00
Tuesday 1 st - Saturday 5 th August 2023	07:00 - 20:00
Sunday 6 th August 2023	07:00 - 18:00

19. COLLECTING RING

The Stewards in charge of the Collecting Ring will have sole control of the entrance and exits to the Arena/Ring. All competitors must present their horses and ponies at the Collecting Ring prior to admission to the Arena/Ring. Collecting rings must not be used for exercise once competition has finished each day.

20. DRESS

Protective headgear, must be worn at all times when mounted by anyone, whether or not a competitor, which complies to the below standards at any British Showjumping competition or activity. Harnesses must be properly adjusted and fastened at all times when mounted.

21. NUMBERS

No substitution will be permitted unless the Duty Veterinary Surgeon certifies that the declared horse has become unfit to compete since the time of declaration.

Competition numbers must be worn by horses/ponies at all times during competition and in the exercise areas – these must be collected from the equestrian office.

22. DECORATIONS

No animal may, except in Championships, be decorated with any prize rosettes until after it has been judged. Rosettes will not be duplicated if lost or mislaid except at the expense of the competitor, and should, therefore, be carefully preserved.

23. PRIZE GIVINGS

Prize givings will be mounted. All animals must attend prize givings whenever so ordered by the Organisers or an authorised Show Official. Any failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification from competing and forfeiture of prizes and/or prize money as per British Showjumping rules 101.7 and 202.2. Owners of winning horses or ponies are invited to attend the prize giving of Finals held in the Championship Arenas and Arena 3. Winning owners may accompany their horse or pony into the arena and therefore must be available in the collecting ring immediately at the end of the class if they wish to accompany their horse into the prize giving.

24. VETERINARY SURGEONS, DOCTORS AND FARRIER

The services of a Veterinary Surgeon, Medical Personnel and Farriers will be available on the showground or on call, day and night. All costs will be the responsibility of the rider/driver/owner/handler/competitor/ producer.

25. MEDICATION CONTROL

For national showjumping, the Organisers reserve the right to instruct a Veterinary Surgeon or Chief Steward to take random tests on horses and ponies in any competition at the Show. These tests will be carried out in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of British Showjumping.

Should Grandstand Media Ltd. subsequently, at any time, be advised by a governing body that a positive dope test carried out at the British Showjumping National Championships has been recorded against an animal competing at the show, Grandstand Media Ltd. will automatically disqualify the animal concerned. Grandstand Media Limited reserve the right to share qualifier and HOYS entry information with the relevant society, and vice versa, for the purpose of HOYS matters to include, but not limited to, qualification or disciplinary.

26. INCIVILITY

- I. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any Judge, Steward or to any Show Official on the part of the competitor, groom, rider, owner, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such Official, disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.
- II. Incivility, at any stage, towards a Show Official is unacceptable and, at the complete discretion of the Show Organisers, may result in the offender being asked to leave the Show or made subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, a fine, suspension or exclusion from any part of the Show. In this connection, exhibitors and competitors are reminded of their responsibility for the actions of others, in accordance with the terms of Rule 31 below.

27. OBJECTIONS

Any objection or protest is to be lodged by obtaining a printed Objection Form from the Show Secretary at the Show which must be completed by and signed by the Objector and delivered to the Show Secretary accompanied by a deposit of £100.00 in cash within 30 minutes after the results have been announced in the arena, in respect of which the objection is lodged.

Grandstand Media Ltd. is unable to accept objections involving Joint Measurement Board (JMB) certificates. The objection shall be determined by the Appeals Committee who may require and receive such evidence as they think fit and in particular may require the Objector or the Competitor in respect of which such objection was lodged to make a statutory declaration upon any question of fact concerning the matter of such objection.

If the objection shall be determined against the Objector, he shall also be liable to the Show for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the Organisers who determine the objection there existed good and reasonable grounds for the objection, when they may order to the contrary.

All objections relating to showjumping competitions must be made in accordance with Rule 198 of the British Showjumping Members Handbook.

28. DISQUALIFICATION

In the event of any animal being disqualified whether as the result of any objection or otherwise, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that competition shall take the prize awarded to such disqualified animal. The result of the class will be reset as if the disqualified animal had not taken part in the competition.

29. RESPONSIBILITY

The organisers of the British Showjumping National Championships have no liability to the competitor for any accident, injury, damage, illness, disease or other loss occurring to the competitor's property and/or animals and shall only have liability to the competitor for personal injury or death to the extent caused by or contributed to by their negligence.

The competitor shall be responsible to the Organising Team of the British Showjumping National Championships, their principals and Grandstand Media Ltd for losses suffered by them to the extent that it arises from or is contributed to in any way by any act, neglect or omission by the competitor or by any person for whom or of any animal for which the competitor is responsible.

Competitors must have in place adequate, sufficient third-party insurance cover for the participation at the British Showjumping National Championships 2023.

All children under the age of 14, must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times while on the showground. Each competitor will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of their animals and for any other servants or agents of theirs for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these Rules and Regulations.

30. INSURANCES

All exhibitors, competitors, owners, riders, handlers, trainers, drivers and/or producers. at the British Showjumping National Championships are personally responsible for damages to any building, land, equipment or otherwise on the Showground or other areas of the NAEC, Stoneleigh or to any third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a requirement that they have in force third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in or at the British Showjumping National Championships. Such insurance cover for third-party liability should be for no less than £2million.

31. DECISIONS

The decision of the Organisers (including their employees, representatives and show officials) the Veterinary Surgeons and any Judges upon any of the matters required by the foregoing Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting of any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objection shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie there from on any ground whatsoever.

32. ORGANISERS POWERS

From herein the organisers shall have power:

- To interpret these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions applicable to the competitions and to appoint Stewards and Officials for the enforcement thereof and for the purposes of the Show generally and such persons shall have full power accordingly.
- II. The right to make amendments to the Schedule, the General Rules and Regulations of the British Showjumping National Championships or any of the Show's classes and their associated rules as necessary at any time and use reasonable endeavours to notify such changes to each entered competitor. Any such change will be displayed in the Equestrian Office and/or Stable Manager's office at the show.
- III. In addition to the provisions relating to Objections to determine any matter, question or difference whatever arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show or to these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions and the decisions of such Stewards and Officials shall be final and binding and no appeal shall lie there from, and shall also have power in case of emergency or expediency to suspend or relax any Rule or Regulation for such period and to such extent and in such manner as they think fit.

33. RULES

Provided always that when a competition is held under National Rules, such National Rules of an affiliated association or society as are appropriate to the type and class of competition shall apply and shall have effect throughout such competition until immediately after the announcement of the results thereof.

34. PLACARDS AND NOTICES

No placard or notice of any description shall be placed on any stall, vehicle or circulated in the Show without the signed permission of the Organisers.

35. PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO CAMERAS

The use of cameras and video cameras or such other photographic or filming equipment is strictly limited to personal use and may not be used for any commercial gain.

36. TELEVISION/ VIDEO/ FILMING/MARKETING

It is a condition of participation at the British Showjumping National Championships that all participants agree to allow official photography and recording of themselves and their property during any part of the show. It is a further condition of participation that all participants allow all such photographed and recorded materials to be used, at the Organiser's discretion, for broadcasting, future promotion and/or publicity in respect of the British Showjumping National Championships, its sponsors and partners.

37. HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors must adhere to any Health and Safety policies issued to them from time to time by the Organisers. These will be displayed in the Stable Manager's Office and the Show Office on the showground.

38. HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety. The Show is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the show are responsible for ensuring that:

- I. Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the Show
- II. They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
- III. Access to and egress from the site is safe.
- IV. Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety legislation.

38.1 Emergencies

- I. Emergency services must have access to all parts of the show site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.
- II. First Aid points are clearly marked.
- III. In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or steward.

38.2 Horses

Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas and to avoid behaviour that might alarm horses. Children must be supervised by parents/guardians at all times.

39. NOISE CURFEW

For residents living adjacent to the NAEC, the organisers in line with Warwick District Council orders are imposing a noise curfew on the showground (including the stable area and horsebox parking area) between the hours of 23:00 and 06:30 on each day. Accordingly, every competitor must use their best endeavours to ensure that noise generated in these areas is kept to an absolute minimum, so as not to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents.

40. SUITABILITY OF RIDER

Equine welfare is of paramount importance and all riders must at all times be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden which includes horses/ponies being warmed up and/or exercised (anywhere at British Showjumping National Championships to include but not limited to exercise areas Collecting Rings or vehicle parks day or night). The organisers and their representatives reserve the right to take further action against any competitor and/or groom who permits any person (including a competitor and/or groom) to ride a horse or pony when the size and/or weight of the rider compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden. The issue of welfare will be determined by the on-site veterinary team and will include vets, stewards and officials having the authority to require the rider to dismount to enable a member of the onsite veterinary team to determine whether in the opinion of the vet the rider is of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony. The decision of the vet shall be final.

SPECIAL RULES RELATING TO THE BRITISH SHOWJUMPING NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

Flu vaccinations are mandatory for all registered horses and ponies and they must be in possession of a valid flu vaccination certificate. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the horse's vaccinations are up to date and correctly recorded on the diagrammatic vaccination record. Spot checks will be regularly carried out at shows. The horse/pony must have received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Only these two injections need to have been given before a horse/pony can compete in competitions. In addition, a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year apart. Horses/Ponies must have received the full course of vaccinations or the booster at least 7 days prior to the competition date, and not more than 1 year after the previous booster.

1. ENTRIES

The following closing dates for entries will be strictly adhered to and entries received after the appropriate closing date will **NOT** be accepted.

Competitors who qualify late in the season and have not received confirmation of their qualification from British Showjumping before close of entries, please contact the office before Wednesday 26th July for details of how to make their entry on 02476 858205 or email <u>entries@grandstand.co.uk</u>. No qualification will be passed down the line for any Championships Finals or Finals within 48 hours of the start of the British Showjumping National Championships.

2. DRAWN ORDERS

The order of jumping for classes will be drawn. The Start List will be available from the Show Secretaries Office and online at <u>www.bsnationalchampionships.co.uk</u>. Approximate start times of each showjumping class will be published the afternoon of the preceding day.

- I. Horses must jump in the order they appear on the start list unless special permission has been obtained from the Organisers/Judges.
- II. During the competition, three competitors must always be ready to enter the arena. If a competitor does not respond when his/her number is called, the competitor will lose his/her turn and the horse bearing the number called may be eliminated from the competition in progress.
- III. Should entries in any jumping competition be excessive, in order that the timetable may be adhered to, the Organisers/Judges reserve the right to request that competitors leave the arena when they have been penalised by a number of faults which, in the opinion of the judges, gives the competitor no chance of being placed for any award as per rule 203.3.
- IV. The Organisers themselves, with prior permission from the Chief Executive of British Showjumping, reserve the right to cancel or add to any of the conditions of this schedule or amend the conditions of any competition, dividing classes into sections, or cancelling sections, and to amend prize money as the necessity of the programme may require. Also to hold any competition in the morning or on any such occasion or time, or at any such place as they may deem necessary.
- V. The first three prize winners in each competition may be asked to make themselves available to meet the Sponsors and/or the Press after the completion of their class.
- VI. Competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddlecloth in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 102.10
- VII. Rule 82.19 "No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to attend a show compete or be prepared to compete, in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other horses/ponies, competitors and members of the public are not put at risk of injury" Also refer to Rule 102.13.
- VIII. Class times stated are for guidance only and the Organisers reserve the right to amend these at any time.
 - IX. In accordance with British Showjumping Rules, once a class has commenced substitution of a rider or horse/pony is not permitted in subsequent sections of the class.
 - X. Rule 76.6 will be applied to all British Showjumping classes.
- XI. A JMB height certificate will be required for all ponies competing in Championship Finals and Finals and must be logged with British Showjumping before the start of the show. Any pony that does not have a valid height certificate will not be allowed to compete.

To be crowned the winner of the International Stairway League combinations must have started in this final leg. There will be three HOYS International Wild Cards allocated after the International Stairway Final. The allocation of Wild Cards to riders eligible for British Team selection will be made in the following order:

- 1. One to the winner of the International Stairway League. Should the winning rider not be eligible for British Team selection or have already qualified for a HOYS International Wild Card then the Wild Card will be allocated down the International Stairway League. It is also a criteria that the eligible horse/rider combination competes in the Final at the British Showjumping National Championships, NAEC, Stoneleigh.
- 2. One to the winner of the International Stairway Final who will also receive the title of British Showjumping National Champion for a period of 12 months. Should the winner of the Final not be eligible for British Team selection or have already qualified for HOYS via an International Wild Card, the Wild Card will be allocated to the next eligible rider on the International Stairway League table. The title of National Champion, irrelevant of rider nationality will be retained by the winner of the International Stairway Final.
- 3. One card to the winner of the National Championship Show League which will run across the show culminating with the International Stairway Final. This league will run independently to all other leagues, points towards qualification will be awarded to each rider according to their placing in each of these three qualifying competitions. To be eligible for points in the show league combinations must be entered into class 10 block entry (all three sections). Should the winner of the National Championship Show League not be eligible for British Team selection or have already qualified for a HOYS International Wild Card, then the Wild Card will be allocated down the National Championship Show League.

An additional wildcard will be awarded to the highest placed rider, between 18 and 25 years of age, within the top 10 of the National Championship Show League that takes place at the British Showjumping National Championships (BSNC) $1^{st} - 6^{th}$ August 2023. Points towards qualification will be awarded to each rider according to their placing in each of these three qualifying competitions. Please note that National Championship Show League rules apply as stated in appendix 1. Winners of this wildcard will be required to bring three horses (minimum of two) to HOYS to jump the international classes (plus one for the Puissance/Six Bar should they wish).

Appendix 1 – BSNC Show League Wild Card Qualifying Criteria

Eligibility

Riders already invited to compete at Horse of the Year Show (HOYS) 2023 may compete in these classes but will be disregarded from the point's allocation table, although the prize money will be awarded.

Open to horses in Grade A and B (as at the first day of the show) to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior members of British Showjumping.

PLEASE NOTE: Whilst Associate and Junior members may compete in the above classes and may qualify to compete in the International Competitions at HOYS, due to FEI regulations, any competitor who will not attain the age of eighteen during the 2023 calendar year will not be eligible to compete in the Leading Show Jumper of the Year (Grand Prix) or the Puissance at Horse of the Year Show 2023.

Only the best result in each class will be counted for riders who are competing on more than one horse.

Qualification

Qualifies for the International Competitions at Horse of the Year Show 2023 where the qualified rider will be entitled to enter three horses (minimum of two) plus one for the Puissance. The horse which gains qualification at the qualifier need not compete at Horse of the Year Show. Horses must be Grade A or Grade B and hold a current FEI passport. However, whilst Grade B horses may compete in the Wild Card qualifiers, Grade B horses may not compete in the International Competitions at HOYS 2023 without written prior approval from British Showjumping.

Number to Qualify

The rider achieving the highest aggregate of points from all three qualifying competitions (Classes 10A, 10B and 10C). In the case of equality for the qualifying place, the rider placed highest in the third qualifying competition (10C) will qualify. Should there still be equality, then the rider placed highest in the second qualifying competition (10B) will qualify.

A rider may only qualify once for the International Show Jumping classes at HOYS 2023 and in the event of double qualification the Wild Card will be offered to the next highest placed rider in the National Championship Show League.

Points towards qualification will be awarded to each rider according to their placing in each of the three qualifying competitions as follows:

Day 1: The first placed eligible rider will receive 15 points, the second placed eligible rider will receive 12 points, and the third placed eligible rider will receive 10 points and so on reducing by one point per placing until the twelfth eligible rider who will receive one point.

Day 2: The first placed eligible rider will receive 15 points, the second placed eligible rider will receive 12 points, and the third placed eligible rider will receive 10 points and so on reducing by one point per placing until the twelfth eligible rider who will receive one point.

Day 3: The first placed eligible rider will receive 25 points, the second placed eligible rider will receive 20 points, and the third placed eligible rider will receive 15 points and so on reducing by one point per placing until the seventeenth eligible rider who will receive one point.

In the case of equality for any one place, the total points from all the equal placings will equally be divided between those tying for those particular placings. Divided points will be rounded up or down as appropriate to one decimal point (i.e. 0.44 points would be rounded down to 0.4, 0.45 points would be rounded up to 0.5).

Horses

All horses must be stabled on the showground for the duration of the HOYS wildcard series. Competitors must be using the correct tack, as listed in the FEI Rule Book. FEI anti-doping regulations will apply.

Stewarding

A British Showjumping Stipendiary Steward will be in attendance on all three days.

Appendix 2 – International Stairway Points Allocation
